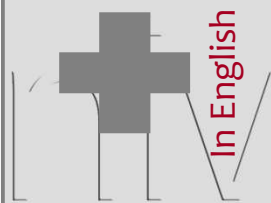

All 4-week summer programs consist of two courses: one Spanish language course and one specialized course taught in English.

Students complete a total of 90 hours of instruction (45 contact hours per course).

## Overview

*No previous knowledge of Spanish is required*

All programs are designed to accommodate students from beginner through advanced levels of Spanish language. A placement test is given at the start of the programme to determine each student's level of Spanish proficiency.

In addition to completing two courses and improving their knowledge of the language, students will be immersed in the Spanish culture while living in Madrid--one of Europe's liveliest capital cities. Our Dehesa de la Villa campus is conveniently located in the university area of Madrid and easily accessible by public transportation.

To facilitate cultural integration, all programs feature six cultural activities (included in the program fee). For an additional fee, we also offer lodging with a Spanish family and activities such as one-day excursions, an evening event, and a farewell dinner.



# Program Structure



## SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSE

**Beginners** will learn grammar and vocabulary to cope with everyday life situations. Cross-cultural contents are integrated into all classes.

**Intermediates** will constantly expand their oral Spanish skills as well as write and work on grammar in context. They will increase their vocabulary and also get to know Spain's customs and traditions.

**Advanced and Superior** students can select courses to suit their specific needs and interests. Typical courses include Advanced Grammar, Written Expression or specialized courses in Spanish History, Literature, and Art.

## IN ENGLISH\*

### ART IN SPAIN

This course is an introduction to art in Spain over the past five hundred years. It focuses on certain key topics and periods that help the students map out the particular nature of Spanish artistic culture through the centuries. The course will place special emphasis on the works of internationally renowned Spanish artists such as Velázquez, Goya, Picasso, Dalí and Miró.

### INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT

This course will deal with multiple functions of management, such as organizing, coordinating, planning, and staffing, in an international cross-cultural context. Differing national cultures affect management functions in different ways. The focus will be on how international management is more complex. Intercultural communication, expatriate compensation, gender issues, and ethical conflicts will also be discussed.

### EUROPEAN STUDIES: CULTURE, HISTORY AND INTEGRATION

This course will cover relevant political, economic, and social aspects of European history and culture by examining the interaction among nation-states and their impact on other parts of the world. Students acquire basic intellectual skills through emphasis on critical thinking, considering questions of why and how events occurred. Topics will include European expansion, Political Revolutions, Industrialization, Nationalism, Colonialism, European wars and the European Union.

### ARTS MANAGEMENT: POLICY AND PRACTICE IN THE EUROPEAN UNION (JULY)

This course is an introduction to the historical context, the cultural policies and the issues impacting arts organizations, managers, and artists in the European Union. Meetings with administrators and work on independent creative projects will enhance students' understanding of competencies possessed by effective arts managers as well as the market for the arts in Europe. The course includes visits to Madrid's leading visual arts and culture institutions.

\* For academic and scheduling reasons students may enroll in only one English class per month.

## IN ENGLISH\*

### **DRAWING IN MADRID: Life and on sight drawing to discover Spain's artistic heritage. (JULY)**

This course is an intense studio drawing course where students not only improve their life drawing skills, but also practice on sight drawing. Students will draw from the model and their daily experiences of being in a European capital city. Most important, they will have the chance to draw on sight the works of Artists such as Titian, Rubens, Velazquez, El Greco and Goya, among others. This course offers a hybrid approach to drawing with simultaneous lectures on Spanish art, society and the contemporary art scene in Madrid.

**TUITION**

**995 €/student/month**

- **Two academic classes, each with 45 hours of instruction per month.**
- Six accompanied visits typically include: Royal Palace, Spanish Parliament, the Senate, Prado Museum, Reina Sofia Museum and guided walks through historic areas of Madrid.

**HOUSING**

- **Accommodation with Spanish families, full board.** Full board includes three meals per day: breakfast, lunch and dinner. **840 €/student/month**
- Accommodation with Spanish families, half board. Half board includes two meals per day: breakfast and lunch/dinner. **715 €/student/month**

**LEISURE AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**

- A guided Saturday excursion to historic towns such as Toledo, Salamanca, Segovia or Ávila/El Escorial. Includes transportation on a chartered bus, guided visits and entrance to sites. **40 €/excursion**

**TRANSPORTATION**

**65 €/student/month**

- **Monthly travel pass** good for most public transport (bus and subway) in Madrid called “Abono Transporte”. We will provide you with one if you send us a passport-size photograph and a photocopy of your passport in advance.

Students who wish to take June AND July Programs will pay 1900 € for both.
